

Electricity bills denmark

Electricity prices in Copenhagen, Denmark, are determined by a combination of factors, including the cost of generating electricity, the cost of transporting it, and government taxes and fees.

The prices can vary depending on the time of day and the amount of electricity being used. Many households in Copenhagen have opted for renewable energy sources, such as wind and solar power, to reduce their carbon footprint and lower their electricity bills.

It costs EUR0.45 to shower for 10 minutes in Copenhagen. If you are showering for 10 minutes once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR13.5 per month. If you decide to reduce showers to 5 minutes, you would save EUR6.75.

It costs EUR0.06 to run the washing machine in Copenhagen. If you are running the washing machine once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR1.8 per month. If you decide to running the washing machine every 2nd day, you would save EUR0.90.

It costs EUR0.02 to vacuum for 10 minutes in Copenhagen. If you are vacuuming for 5 minutes once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR0.6 per month. If you decide to vacuum every 2nd day, you would save EUR0.30.

It costs EUR0.02 to use a hairdryer for 10 minutes in Copenhagen. If you are using a hairdryer for 10 minutes once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR0.6 per month. If you decide to use the hairdryer for 5 minutes, you would save EUR0.30.

It costs EUR0.05 to watch 1 hour of TV in Copenhagen. If you are watching 1 hour of TV once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR1.5 per month. If you decide to reduce tv usage by 2 hours a day, you would save EUR0.75.

Denmark is divided into two electricity price areas: Jylland and Fyn (Jutland and Funen) and Sjaelland og ?erne (Zealand and the Islands). Check the electricity prices from Nord Pool for each of these two price areas [here](#).

In addition to the price differences between the regions, you should also be aware that the electricity price can change over time. It is therefore advisable to check the electricity prices regularly to find the cheapest hours to use electricity.
