

# Lenovo tinkpad battery not detected

Lenovo tinkpad battery not detected

If your MacBook can't detect your battery or an X displays over the battery icon, the MacBook might be having trouble charging. The X usually indicates Low Power Mode, so give the laptop a few extra minutes to see if it's able to recharge. If your MacBook's battery can be removed easily, shut it down, remove the battery, replace the battery, and start it back up. Otherwise, reset the SMC (System Management Controller).

If your laptop only receives power when the charger is plugged in, this means the battery is unable to charge or can't hold a charge. Shut down the laptop and remove the battery, then wait for a few minutes before putting it back in and turning things on again. If the battery still won't charge, you may need to get a replacement.

If your laptop isn't charging, it could be having trouble detecting the charger. Try using a different charger or try plugging the charger into a different outlet, in case the problem is with the socket connection. If that doesn't help, you may need to reinstall or update your drivers.

Hello all. There have been many, many reports of people having issues with their X1 Carbon Gen 7 batteries. Specifically, an error stating "Battery not detected," and the inability to use the laptop without the charger plugged into the wall. I've seen a few posts on this subreddit about the issue.

**POSSIBLE SOLUTION:** This issue has been plaguing me for some time. Recently I encountered a Lenovo forum thread on the topic. Apparently this is a really big issue many X1 Carbon owners and firmware updates don't seem to be fixing it.
